Before you pick a cabin number

- ☐ Who is sleeping in the room - and are the beds actually comfortable for that group?
- ☐ Do you need connecting or nearby cabins?
- ☐ Is anyone sensitive to motion?
- ☐ Does anyone use a stroller, cane, walker or wheelchair?
- ☐ What is directly above and below the cabin?
- ☐ Is the balcony truly ocean-facing, or does it face an internal neighborhood?

Location shortcut

Lower and more central cabins generally feel less motion. Cabins near elevators can be wonderfully convenient for grandparents and families with strollers, while cabins farther down the hall may be quieter.

What you gain - and what to watch

INTERIOR Usually lowest price. Great if you use the room mostly to sleep. Less natural light can be a downside for some travelers.	OCEANVIEW Natural light without balcony pricing. Window size and location vary by ship/category.
BALCONY Private outdoor space can be a major quality-of-life upgrade. On some large ships, not every balcony faces the ocean.	SUITES More space and potential suite benefits, but the value depends on the exact suite category and ship.
CONNECTING ROOMS Excellent for families who want separation and two bathrooms. Confirm they are truly connecting, not merely adjacent.	GUARANTEE CABIN Can save money but reduces control over location. Avoid if being near family, avoiding noise or minimizing walking is important.

Red flags worth checking

- Directly under pool deck, late-night venue or high-traffic space
- Very far forward/aft if motion is a concern
- Long walk from elevators for mobility-conscious travelers
- Obstructed-view or neighborhood-facing balcony when ocean view is expected
- Poor sleeping arrangement for four adults or older children
